



## Cuddle Event Covid Safety Survey Results

Which of the following is true for you? 89 responses






This survey was created to get opinions from our community about their Covid safety as part of our broader research to determine if starting events in July 2021 is possible.



I would only attend a cuddle event if it were outdoors. 75 responses




I would attend a cuddle event only if it's required that all attendees prove that they are vaccinated. 89 responses




